Team Rules for Sunday League 2025:

Teams can be mixed age and gender and consist of 6 players (5+goalie) on the court, standard floorball rules apply. A minimum of 5 players are required to start a game and teams can have unlimited rolling subs.

Games are 2 x 15 minute halves each.

Social Competitive Grade

The Social Competitive Grade is one competition with three pools (A/B/C) based on skill level. The grade is aimed at giving experienced teams games that are appropriate to their ability.

Team rules for the Social Competitive Grade:

- Teams can have a <u>maximum of 5 WFL players per team per game</u>. There are two situations where a WFL player in social competitive grade does not count towards this total: A WFL goalie who plays on a stick and a WFL stick player who is playing in goal.
- <u>Players can only play in ONE social competitive team</u> during the term.
 Eg: You cannot play in one A team and one B team. You also cannot play in two A teams or two B teams.
- Teams must have at least two players who are either female and/or juniors (under 16) and/or senior players (55 years and older) on the court at all times. This can be the goalie.
- Players <u>Year 10 and under count as juniors</u> and the minimum age to play is Year 7. We ask that team managers consider the ability of younger players before adding them to a team.
- Teams must <u>submit a full team list</u> in order for their registration to be approved.
- After each game, <u>team captains must sign the score card</u> to confirm that both teams have followed the grade rules. Not signing the score card will be taken as a report that the other team has not followed the rules. Teams can also report rule breaches to the Storm Club Committee directly.
- <u>Teams that breach the rules will receive a forfeit</u> for the match (0-5 loss). Upon a third forfeit, the team will be removed from the competition.

Social Mates Grade

The Social Mates Grade is one competition with pools based roughly on skill level. The Mates grade is ideal for new teams and beginners, and we ask WFL players not to dominate the court.

Team rules for the Social Mates Grade:

 Teams can have a <u>maximum of 2 WFL players per team per game</u>. There are two situations where a WFL player in a social mates team does not count towards this total: A WFL goalie who plays on a stick and a WFL stick player who is playing in goal. <u>These players may score</u>.

- <u>WFL players are not allowed to score</u> in this grade. A goal scored by a WFL player, including direct deflections, will be discounted and a free hit awarded to the other team from in front of their goal.
- Players can only <u>play in one Social Mates team</u> during the term.
- Teams must have at least two players who are either female and/or juniors and/or 55 years or older on the court at any one time. This can be the goalie.
- Players <u>Year 10 and under count as juniors</u> and the minimum age to play is Year 7.
- Teams <u>must submit a full team list</u> in order for their registration to be approved.
- Teams can report rule breaches to the Storm Club Committee. <u>Teams that breach the rules</u> will receive a forfeit for the match (0-5 loss).

Frequently Asked Questions:

Can I play in two teams?

- Yes, you can play in two teams as long as one is in Social Mates grade and one is in Social Competitive grade.

I'm a WFL goalie but I play on stick for a mates team, can I score in Mates grade?

- Yes, you can.

Who counts as a WFL player?

- Any player that was registered for a WFL team last year. We suggest you check with your team members whether they are a WFL player.

Who counts as a WFL goalie?

- Any WFL player that was in goal for at least half of the WFL matches they played in last year.
